My first experience with Knoxville Habitat for Humanity was on a cold, wet day while painting the interior of a Habitat home. Portable heaters were set up to warm the inside of the home, making it comfortable for the volunteers to do their work. I was touched by the comradery of the volunteers as they worked together with love and enthusiasm ... they knew they were painting a home that was going to give a hardworking family a new start on life.

My next opportunity at a Habitat house was with a group of high school students coming together in the service of building with a family. They laughed and worked together, willingly giving their time on a precious Saturday morning. They did it because they earned service hours but, as they worked alongside the family, their enthusiasm grew as they came to understand they weren't just building a house ... they were building a *home* with a deserving family.

With both of these builds, and as always once a house is completed, the home is dedicated. The family (and soon-to-be homeowners), Covenant Partners, volunteers and Knoxville Habitat staff join together to bless the home all has worked on. I listened to the prayers and the loving words and witnessed the smiles and tears of joy as the new homeowners were handed the keys and the mortgage book. It was a commitment now ... both of these families now had a home to call their own! At that point, I "got it" ... as did everyone at the dedication.

Knoxville Habitat is all about providing a hand up, not a hand out, to deserving families. With the solid foundation of a home, families now have a sense of dignity and pride. Their health, physical safety and security improve. Education and job prospects are likely to increase, and family relations and interactions are strengthened.

My experience as a volunteer for Knoxville Habitat has been so rewarding, and I came to understand that I, along with so many others, are helping Knoxville Habitat fulfill its mission: *Seeking to put God's love into action, Knoxville Habitat for Humanity brings people together to build homes, communities and hope.*
